PART F: PROPOSED HERITAGE MAP AMENDMENTS

MLEP 2011: Heritage Maps

Archaeological Sites

Following on from a previous recommendation, namely “**Recommendation L-Sch5-Part 3 (01):** *That a new section titled “Part 3 Archaeological sites” be inserted in Schedule 5 of MLEP 2011 listing all the archaeological sites identified on Council’s property information system those archaeological sites need to be included on the LEP Heritage Map Sheets.*”

Recommendation L-HER_ALL MAPS (01):

That all the archaeological sites, as listed in Recommendation “*Recommendation L-Sch5-Part 3 (01)*” be included on the respective HER Map Sheets.

Note:Diagrams showing the Current Map and Proposed Map for each of the proposed archaeological sites have not been prepared at this stage. The proposed mapping amendments will be incorporated into the documentation submitted to the Department of Planning and Environment seeking final approval and gazettal of the planning proposal.

An inventory sheet for each proposed archaeological site has been prepared. Those sheets are contained in Part G: Proposed Archaeological Sites of this Planning Proposal.

Turpentine - Ironbark Forest Understory, Dulwich Hill Railway cutting

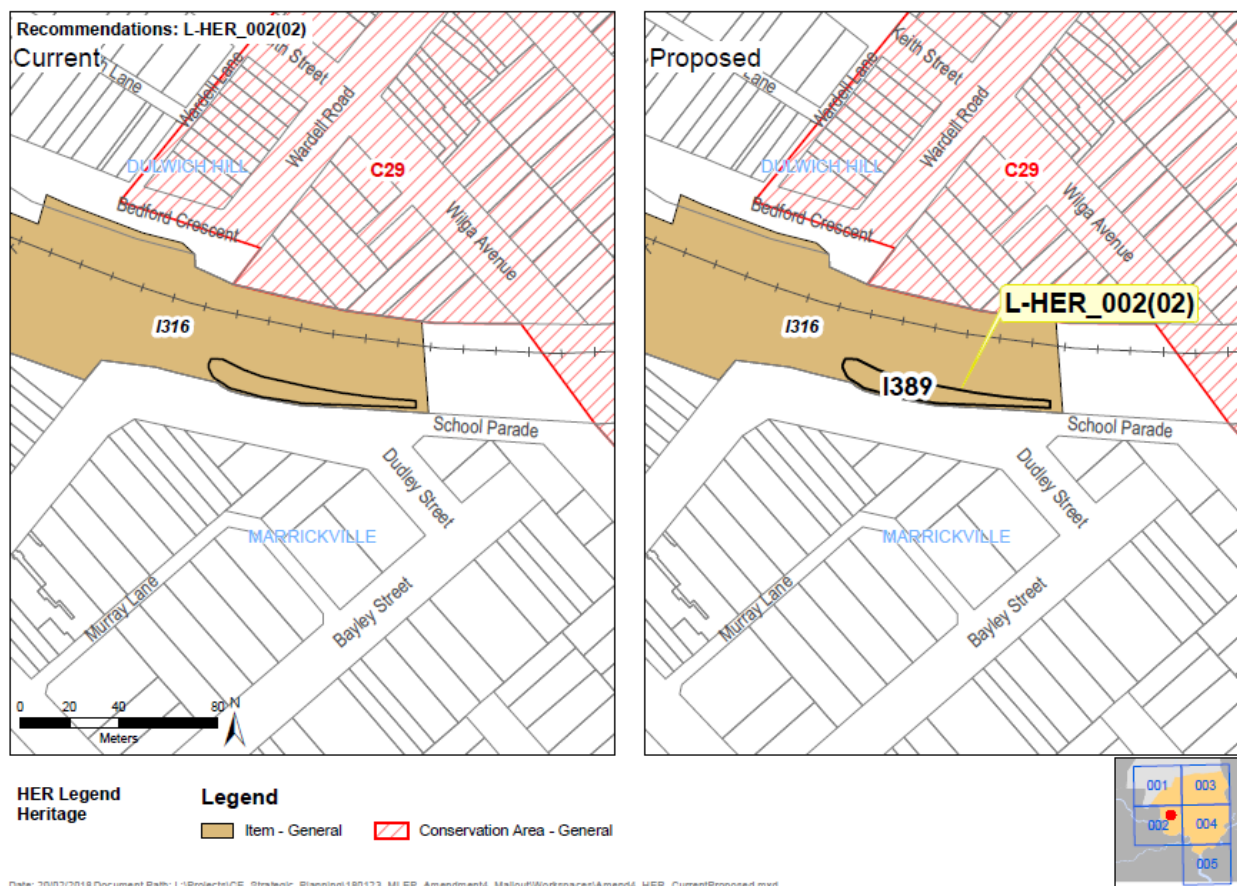
Refer to *Recommendation L-Sch. 5-Part 1 (10)*

Following the recommendation that the Turpentine- Ironbark Forrest Understory, Dulwich Hill Railway cutting be listed as a heritage item, the property needs to be identified on the Heritage Map with distinctive colouring, with black edging with its heritage item reference number.

Recommendation L-HER_002 (02):

That the Turpentine - Ironbark Forest Understory, Dulwich Hill Railway cutting on the northern side of Dudley Street, Marrickville on the eastern side of Wardell Road, be identified with distinctive colouring, with black edging with its heritage item reference number on Heritage Map (HER_002).

7-13 Bedford Street, Newtown (The Hub Theatre)

Following the recommendation that the Hub Theatre at 7-13 Bedford Street, Newtown be listed as a heritage item, the property needs to be identified on the Heritage Map with distinctive colouring, with black edging with its heritage item reference number.

Recommendation L-HER_003 (01):

That the property 7-13 Bedford Street, Newtown (The Hub Theatre) be identified with distinctive colouring, with black edging with its heritage item reference number on Heritage Map (HER_003).
