
# **Background**

Marrickville Golf Course is a 20 hectare area of land, which is predominantly owned by Council. The land is leased to the Golf Club under the proviso that it provides public access to the open spaces. The club has depended on irrigation water from Dibble Avenue Waterhole since the 1940s and continues to do so under existing rights.

Dibble Avenue Waterhole is a locally listed Heritage Item and Priority Biodiversity Site as it provides refuge for aquatic plants and animals. Following the collapse of the banks at the north-east side of the waterhole in February 2017, Council made emergency repairs and is working on a separate remediation plan to make the banks safe and stable.

The development of the plans provides opportunities to introduce best practice sustainable land and environmental management for both sites.

The process will look at ways to improve safe public access to the golf course and increase everyone's enjoyment of the spaces. It will also investigate alternative water sources for the golf course and acceptable limits on water extraction into the future.

- Initial engagement period open for comment until 25 June 2018
- **Creating the Plan of Management** and Master Plans

Community comments and input from other stakeholders will be used along with research and expert advice - July 2018

**Public exhibition** 

Everyone is invited to have their say on the draft Plan of Management and Master Plans – have we got it right? – September 2018

**Decision by Council** 

After the public exhibition, feedback is taken into consideration and final drafts prepared for decision by Council - February 2019

Council implements the plans

Works will be prioritised and implemented over the next 10 years dependent on funding Over the next 10 years
