Right now, Council has a once in a generation chance to create a regional recreation precinct at Tempe Reserve that will benefit the whole of the inner west.

We are planning for the future of the Reserve, and we want to hear from you about how to manage and develop it over the coming years.

Council has already endorsed a new program of installing synthetic surfaces at a small selection of sporting grounds in the Inner West to meet the growing demand from local families and sports clubs for more spaces to play. Tempe Reserve has been identified as the highest priority site.

This is a great opportunity to get the right balance of sporting grounds, play areas and natural open spaces for the Inner West.

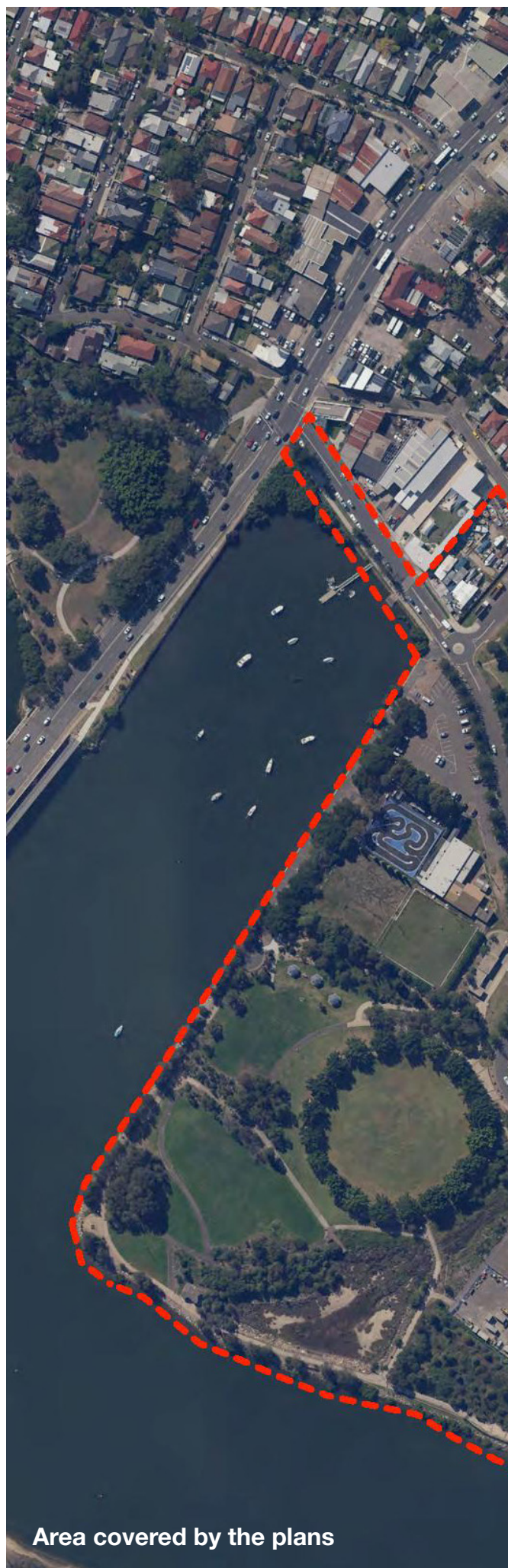
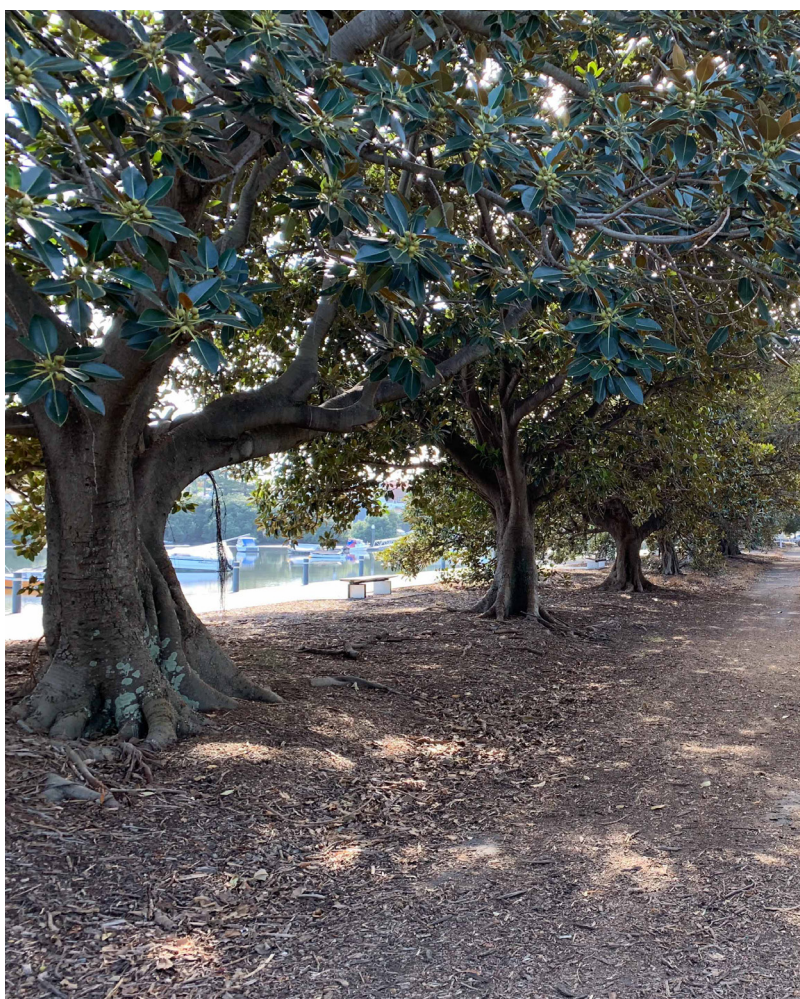
Upgrade features for Tempe Reserve

New synthetic turf sporting fields

At its meeting on 28 May 2019 Council endorsed Tempe Reserve as the preferred site for a synthetic sport surface upgrade. This will allow our local sporting groups to use the fields for more of the year increasing sporting participation. Construction is planned for Summer 2020/21.

Lighting upgrade

Council has approved funding for a park lighting upgrade to replace existing pathway lighting. Construction is planned for 2020/21.



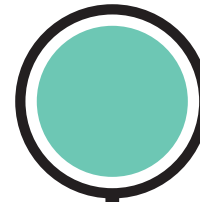
Area covered by the plans

sporting fields

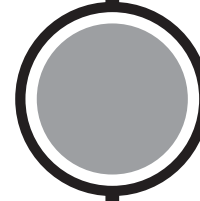


Timeline



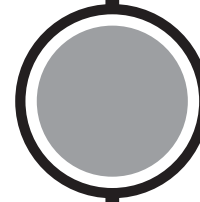

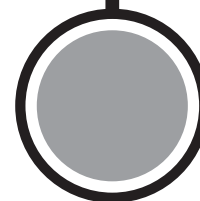
Creating the Plan of Management and Master Plan
