

## **Quong Tart Plaza**

Dear Community Member,

I am writing about the naming of Quong Tart Plaza which will recognise the long-standing contributions of people of Chinese backgrounds to Ashfield.

This is part of Council's continuing commitment to honouring our migrant communities' contributions to the Inner West. In recent years we've named the precincts Little Portugal in Petersham, Little Italy in Leichhardt, Little Greece, and Little Vietnam in Marrickville.

#### What's happening now?

We're proposing to add 'Quong Tart Plaza' as an additional name for Hercules Street, Ashfield. Hercules Street, Ashfield will still remain a valid address, however we would like to highlight the area where a memorial bust of Moy Quong Tart 梅光達 is displayed proudly in the street.

### About Moy Quong Tart 梅光達 (1850-1903)

A celebrated philanthropist, businessman and Ashfield local, Quong Tart was born in China and moved to the Australian goldfields at the age of nine. He was a prominent merchant of the nineteenth century and made a significant impact on the social and political scene of Sydney during a period of strong Anti-Chinese sentiment in Australia. Often, he was regarded as a patron to the vulnerable and poor, alleviating poverty through charitable efforts, and providing reasonable employment conditions for staff, all of which was uncommon at the time.
