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# Engagement outcomes report GreenWay Missing Links Draft Design Plan

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# Summary

The Cooks to Cove GreenWay is a biodiversity and active transport corridor linking the Cooks River to Iron Cove. The GreenWay is on the traditional lands of the Gadigal-Wangal people.

The draft design plans of the central and southern in-corridor "missing links" of the Cooks to Cove GreenWay were available for comment from Tuesday 4 April to Wednesday 3 May 2023. The intention of the engagement was to ensure the draft designs are true to the adopted Masterplan.

Over 2,500 people took part in the engagement either online via the Your Say Inner West (YSIW) engagement platform, at an onsite community pop-up stall, via email or over the phone.

The YSIW site was viewed 6,925 times by 2,571 individuals, while close to 150 people attended an onsite pop-up engagement session.

The main themes and concerns raised during the engagement were:

- 1. plantings & biodiversity
- 2. user safety
- 3. nearby resident privacy
- 4. post-construction maintenance

# Background

The Cooks to Cove GreenWay mostly follows the route of the Inner West Light Rail and Hawthorne Canal and features cycle paths and foreshore walks, cultural and historical sites, artworks, cafes, bushcare sites and a range of parks, playgrounds and sporting facilities. Once completed it will measure 5.6km from Cooks River to Iron Cove.

The GreenWay Masterplan was adopted by Inner West Council in 2018 after extensive community consultation. The concept designs were then developed and placed on exhibition for further feedback in 2019.

Council is completing this project in stages. At the time of engagement, some sections of the GreenWay were already completed or in progress including the Bay Run upgrade, Richard Murden Reserve in Haberfield and Weston Street and the Hercules Street crossing in Dulwich Hill. After over 10 years of campaigning by the Inner West community and councils, in 2022 funding was secured to complete the "missing links" of the Cooks to Cove GreenWay: the central and southern sections from Parramatta Road through Lewisham West and Dulwich Hill to the Cooks River. These sections run alongside the light rail line and are referred to as in-corridor works.

Council's consultants, Gartner Rose, prepared draft design plans for a final round of community feedback prior to construction. The draft design plans show the extent of the Masterplan works in detail.

# Promotion

The engagement was promoted via the following channels:

- Mayor's letter to adjacent residents (12,000)
- GreenWay email newsletter to recipients who indicated interest in the GreenWay historically (500)
- Email to community members registered on the YSIW platform (372)
- GreenWay Community Forum members and their networks

# **Engagement methods**

Feedback was encouraged via the following methods:

- Online survey on Your Say Inner West
- Emails, phone calls and in writing
- Three onsite pop-up engagement sessions

# **Engagement outcomes**

## **Online survey**

A variety of methods were used to help explain the complex details of the draft design plans. This included copies of the plans, artist impressions, a video presentation explaining key aspects of the designs and 'before and after' images.

To simplify the plans, the in-corridor works were separated into seven sections:

- 1. Leichhardt: Parramatta Road and Hawthorne Canal
- 2. Summer Hill & Lewisham: Cadigal Reserve
- 3. Lewisham: Longport Street
- 4. Lewisham West light rail area & Old Canterbury Road
- 5. Dulwich Hill: Davis Street
- 6. Dulwich Hill: Johnson Park to New Canterbury Road
- 7. Dulwich Hill: Hercules Street

Community members could provide feedback on as many sections of the plans as they liked.


The YSIW page was viewed 6,925 times by 2,571 individuals. The design plans were downloaded 402 times and the video presentation viewed 177 times. 124 surveys were completed.




#### Who did we hear from?

There was an equal representation of respondents from the 30-74 years age brackets. There was a slightly higher proportion of man or male respondents (52%) compared to woman or female (41%), or non-binary/other terms (7%).

The highest proportion of respondents (42%) live in Dulwich Hill, which is where most of the construction will take place, followed by Lewisham (18%) and Summer Hill (14%).








## What did they say?

What is your level of support for the GreenWay draft design plan?

92% (115) of respondents are completely, very, or moderately supportive of the GreenWay draft design plan.



#### Would you like to provide comments on specific sections of the draft design plan?

Community members were invited to provide comment on specific sections of the draft design plans.

30% (37) of respondents did not provide feedback on specific sections. These community members had a higher level of support for the project (84% completely supportive compared to 50% overall) and provided general feedback on the project.

The remaining 88 respondents provided comments on specific sections. The sections of the in-corridor works that received the most comments were:

- 1. Lewisham West light rail area and Old Canterbury Road (37 comments)
- 2. Summer Hill and Lewisham Cadigal Reserve (36 comments)
- 3. Dulwich Hill Davis Street (35 comments)
- 4. Dulwich Hill Johnson Park to New Canterbury Road (33 comments)

## Onsite sessions

Three onsite sessions were held during the engagement period at:

- 1. Wednesday 12 April at Jack Shanahan Reserve Dulwich Hill approximately 25 people attended
- 2. Saturday 15 April at the Bay Run near UTS Rowers Club approximately 35 people attended
- 3. Saturday 15 April at Johnson Park Dulwich Hill approximately 85 people attended

Hard copies of the draft design plans were available on the day, as well as copies of the artist impressions and a map of the current GreenWay path. Community members were given sticky notes and encouraged to add comments to display boards with suggestions and support. Council staff and community members at the Bay Run session:

A key takeaway from the onsite sessions is that Inner West residents feel very positive about the plans and are keen for the GreenWay to be completed.

Some residents are concerned about potential conflicts between pedestrians and cyclists on the path.

Inner West Environment Group (IWEG) members would like to know more details about the proposed plantings to ensure they are varied, suitable for the different areas and truly create biodiversity of flora and fauna.

Some residents living adjacent to the corridor are concerned about privacy, security, parking and noise.

#### Re: GreenWay Missing Links

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the draft designs for the GreenWay between Taverners Hill and Dulwich Hill.

Bicycle NSW has been the peak bicycle advocacy group in NSW for forty-seven years, and has more than 30 affiliated local Bicycle User Groups. Our mission is to *'create a better environment for all bicycle riders'*, and we support improvements to facilities for pedestrians and cyclists. We advocate for new cycling routes that incorporate dedicated paths within both green corridors and the road environment, to provide connections to jobs, schools and services for daily transport and recreation trips. Bike riding provides a healthy, congestion-reducing, low-carbon form of travel that is quiet, efficient and attractive for all ages with the correct infrastructure design.

### Bicycle NSW is delighted to see such high-quality works proposed for the missing links on the GreenWay and fully supports the delivery of the project over the next two years.

The quality of the documentation (Figure 1) is a very positive outcome from the many years of hard work that local advocates, community groups and councils have put into getting the GreenWay to this stage. The designs for the southern section of the GreenWay reflect the community's desire for a safe, off-road corridor that facilitates active transport for people of all ages and abilities. Very importantly, the project will deliver environmental restoration of this degraded blue grid corridor between Iron Cove and the Cooks River.

We applaud Inner West Council for employing world-class landscape architects to design the project. New trees and landscaping will support traffic calming, reduce urban heat and provide increased habitat. Artwork, quality finishes, play equipment, benches, bike racks and water fountains will add delight and amenity to daily trips. The GreenWay will integrate with light rail stations, delivering a multi-modal transport options that unlock car-free mobility across the city. Even better, NSW Government funding allows fantastic grade-separated intersections at Parramatta Rd, Longport St, Davis St, New Canterbury Rd and Constitution Rd.

However, Bicycle NSW would like to raise some **concerns** that should be addressed as the GreenWay Missing Links progress to the construction stages:

• The project does not include an underpass of Old Canterbury Rd at Dulwich Hill.

It is hoped an underpass will be feasible in the future. The proposed signalised crossing is only satisfactory as a temporary solution for negotiating the busy and dangerous Old Canterbury Rd.


• The East West Pedestrian and Cycle Link (EWPCL) that will be delivered by Sydney Metro is not shown or discussed in the GreenWay documentation (Figure 2), and the Greenway has not been indicated in preliminary plans for EWPCL (Figure 3).

It is important that the two projects speak to each other and create a clear and safe intersection where path users can move from one corridor to the other.

As shown in Figure 2, key east-west routes cross the GreenWay at Parramatta Road, Grosvenor Crescent and Longport St, Davis St, Constitution Road, and as discussed, EWPCL near Ewart Street. Figure 3 indicates more local routes that will be considered for the future network.

The GreenWay was conceived as a "spine" that incorporates the "ribs" of the local network. However, the existing and proposed ribs are not explicitly identified in the documentation, and access to the corridor is not facilitated or improved at all crossover points. In particular, access to Davis Street is now via stairs, not a ramp as previously proposed.






Figure 4: Extract from Inner West Council's strategic bike network (left), as established in the 2022 draft Cycling Strategy. This clarifies the key strategic routes across the LGA. The GreenWay corridor is highlighted in green (Source: Inner West Council)

#### Recommendations

- Improve the at-grade intersection with Old Canterbury Road. The light phasing must prioritise
  pedestrian and cyclist level or service. In line with the Road User Space Allocation Policy and other
  State and local strategies, small delays to vehicle traffic should never prevent the delivery of safer, more
  efficient and more attractive active transport infrastructure. Bicycle NSW recommends installing a
  second signalised pedestrian and cyclist crossing on the western side of the intersection. This would
  enable riders to continue on the correct side of Edward Street, if arriving from the Summer Hill shops via
  Wellesley or Smith Streets. To aid local connectivity, we also recommend constructing shared paths on
  both sides of Old Canterbury Rd over the railway bridge, from Weston to Toothill Street, and on the
  north side from Edward Street to McGill Street and beyond.
- Show the EWPLC being delivered by Sydney Metro on the design and construction documentation plans to ensure that all stakeholders are aware of the need to create best possible intersection between the two active transport corridors.
- Include proposed and existing Inner West bike network routes on the GreenWay plan to clarify the location of important nodes and access points. This will help all stakeholders to work together to accommodate best-practice future connections as part of the GreenWay project.
- Future-proof the shared path by allowing for increased demand at the outset. The minimum width of 3.5m meets Austroads standards but may not be adequate to mitigate conflict as use of the corridor grows and population increases. Extra width should be considered wherever possible, particularly at path intersections or where volumes of people walking and cycling may be high.
- To relieve pressure on the GreenWay, and offer faster bike riders a north-south route away from
  pedestrians, it essential to develop safe cycling conditions on parallel local streets. Prioritised cycling
  access on appropriate streets can be achieved with a range of traffic calming interventions to ensure
  very slow vehicle speeds and low traffic volumes. The TfNSW Cycleway Design Toolbox<sup>i</sup> provides
  design standards for a 'quietway' or 'bicycle boulevard'. The network map in Figure 3 show that streets
  such as Hercules St, Denison St and Flood St are under consideration for the future local network and
  may be suitable for quietway treatments. However, close consultation with stakeholders will be required
  to identify the best alternative routes.
- The GreenWay shared path must offer seamless connections to bus stops as well as light rail stations to maximise opportunities for multi-modal trips. Secure bike parking should be provided at all public transport stops.
- Refer to the new Cycleway Design Toolbox<sup>ii</sup> and the 2017 Cycling Aspects of Austroads Guides (AP-G88-17) to ensure that shared paths are constructed to current best practice.
- Ensure that new the cycle and walking infrastructure is inclusive and accommodates all types of bikes and mobility devices, including cargo bikes, tricycles, hand-cycles, recumbents and wheelchair scooters.
- Prioritise active travel at all road intersections with traffic light phasing that optimises pedestrian and bicycle level of service, raised crossings and continuous footpaths at minor intersections. Bicycle paths must continue across the raised crossings so people riding bikes are not required to dismount.
- Reduce speed limits to 30km/h on all residential streets and high pedestrian activity areas in line with global best practice and the UN resolution of August 2020.<sup>iii</sup>

• Remove street parking where necessary to create safe raised crossings, wide shared paths and separated bicycle paths. Council must be strong when faced with resident opposition. On-street parking is fundamentally the storage of private property in the public domain. It makes driving easier and generates car trips.

#### Conclusion

It is clear that local and state politicians are very committed to the GreenWay and recognise the outstanding benefits for the community and the environment. Bicycle NSW hopes that this enthusiasm will drive progress on other important active transport corridors such as Iron Cove Creek and Lilyfield Road.

Bicycle NSW looks forward to working with Inner West Council to progress the delivery of the GreenWay Missing Links. Please reach out with any questions or help needed. 

We are very pleased to see the relocation of the path and councils' commitment to protecting the creek line and riparian zone.

Our review of the design plans highlighted some gaps that need to be addressed in order to achieve this ecological outcome.

Firstly, the continuation of the creek line is not shown on drawing LA 215. Please see below a more accurate representation of the design plans:



How will the path cross the creek and riparian zone if it is to be protected?

We would also like to ensure that any bridge constructed follows best practice with regards to the ecological sensitivity of the area, with respect to supports, materials, and angle to minimize impacts.

The Dulwich Hill Public School community have long been active participants in Geenway projects and planning. We understand there are various stakeholders and access demands to this public domain.

These plans do not show such access requirements for any agencies. We are aware of the impacts of these oversights, having witnessed the original creek restoration, as an offset for the light rail, to be dramatically compromised by the subsequent access demands of Sydney Trains.

At the recent Greenway Community Forum the issue of potential Sydney Water access also now emerged.

To truly deliver on the Greenway Masterplan, as an integrated ecological and active transport corridor, it is essential that these questions be asked and answered in the planning process.

We request more details on these points in writing and to be clearly shown on design drawings.

#### **GreenWay Submission on Design and Construct Documents**

Please accept this submission on behalf of IWEG who formed in 1999 for the express purpose of preserving and creating additional bio-diversity along the GreenWay.

#### General comments:

- IWEG is disappointed in the lack of detail in the design plans
- We strongly urge that meetings be held with local stakeholders (strata managers, strata committee representatives and IWEG) 2-3 weeks before construction begin in or next to their communities so everyone really understands the work to be carried out and the impact on neighbouring residents and Bushcare sites. Misunderstandings can be sorted out and any miss steps can be prevented.
- Signage be placed in areas where construction is about to begin with detailed description of work
- Meetings to be held on site with Bushcare representatives, Urban Ecology and Gartner Rose to try and save as much of the plantings as possible at Hercules Parklands, Waratah Mills and Johnson Park.
- Security fencing, dust and noise mitigation be put in place immediately to protect adjoining residents.
- IWEG to have a point of contact with Gartner Rose construction crew in case of any day-to-day issues or emergencies.
- What experience does Gartner Rose having in building and maintaining bio-diversity
- Is some form of smarting lighting being, used that dimes when there is no movement close by, as is used in parts of the Cooks River bike path, Strathfield end.

#### Maintaining Bio-diversity - A GreenWay not a Grey Way

- Meetings to be held on site with Bushcare representatives, Urban Ecology and Gartner Rose to try and save as much of the plantings as possible at Johnson Park, Waratah Mills and Hercules Parkland.
- A new Urban ecology officer be appointed to solely look after the GreenWay ensuring biodiversity is protected and enhanced. Current staff are far too over committed to take on extra duties.
- Employ a suitably qualified gardener to keep the whole of the GreenWay plantings (outside of Bushcare sites) in good condition, weed free and plants replaced as needed. This person report to Urban Ecology not Parks.
- The GreenWay needs a complex variety of plants, shrubs and trees to improve bio-diversity. We need plants from both STIF, Coastal Sandstone Freshwater and Coastal Swamp communities. We need at least 60 species from each community. At the Arlington grove Complex in Grove St Dulwich Hill, Council required them to plant 50 different species in their native garden adjoining the GreenWay in a very small area. The GreenWay area under construction, while contain many more species, while some are weeds, they provide habitat and food sources for small birds, reptiles, small mammals, and insects. Not replacing with the same diversity will decrease the bio-diversity value of the GreenWay.
- The contractor employed to plant and maintain the new plantings to hold relevant bushcare/bush regeneration qualifications. Weeding to be done by hand to ensure native grasses and small ground covers are not removed by mistake. Regular audits are conducted on this work. Contracts be put in place for maintenance of the native vegetation in perpetuity or by a staff employed specifically for this job.

- Encourage and engage home owners close the GreenWay to take an interest in the planting, biodiversity and help maintain them.
- Maintaining biodiversity especially for small birds requires width as well and length.
- Seeking assurances that if funds run low, the budget for revegetation will not be cut.

#### Hercules Parkland

- IWEG welcome the change to the route of the path to greatly reduce the impact on the creek. It is concerning however that the design maps don't appear to show the start of the creek and where the path will cross the creek
- A bridge to replace the cement pathway over the Creek line. The bridge be built perpendicular to the creek line to minimize the impact and erosion on the creek line and its banks. Cement has a very high pH (> 9) and will leach alkaline water into the creek over time, affecting the frogs, insect life and the plants growing along the edge of the creek.
- Please leave a large area of thicket/weedy area fenced off to retain habitat for small birds, insects, reptiles, and small mammals.
- Is the creek line fenced off from the path, and how close to the path? If not why not. A fence will save the plantings from unintentional damage from dogs, users cutting corners or mischief makers. Large areas of plantings by the City of Sydney and Sydney Water at Federal Park and Jubilee Park Glebe native plantings are now fenced off. A fence as close as possible to the path will help anchor the bio-diversity of the area. This is/ will be the only large wild area along the GreenWay and which has width as well as depth which is vital for small birds, mammals, and reptiles to feel safe in and flourish.
- Crushed sandstone must be used for weed capping and not crushed granite.
- IWEG bird survey group urgently call for a bird survey in the next month, to confirm if any small birds. IWEG is happy to help undertake this survey.

#### Constitution to New Canterbury Rd

- Can you confirm that no more trees will be removed from the section.
- Is there a raise in gradient between Johnson Park and New Canterbury Road?
- How high off the ground is the raised path to be?
- What water run off mitigation will be put in place.

#### Johnson Park

- IWEG was shocked at the extent of clearing of the guerrilla garden adjoining Johnson Park stairs as the area does not appear to be needed for the tunnel works area and was not mentioned in the notification sent to residents. This area is now very quickly being taken over by Caster oil plants which emerge once the soil is disturbed.
- The artists impression bears no resemblance to the detailed design. There are no retaining walls on the plans.

#### Davis St to Johnson Park

- IWEG welcomes the suggestion that the building of the raised path can be done while fencing, with webbing, running along the length of the path separating the path and the Bushcare and stopping unnecessary damage to plantings.
- IWEG feel very strongly that the gates into the Waratah Mills car park **must** remain, be locked, and still be used as an easement access by and for maintenance, emergency access and by the Bushcare groups. The line of site to the right for cars exiting the underground carpark is very poor due to the large hedge and there is a blind spot for cars entering the carpark from Davis Street. It will be very difficult to see a small child should they break away from their family. Local residents can easily access the GreenWay from Davis St and Terry St. A third entrance/exit within a few hundred metres is not needed or necessary.
- Move the path as close as possible to the wall of 5 Terry Street to maximise the amount of Bushcare that can be saved.
- What plans are in place for the very large stormwater grate opposite Waratah car park exit? Will this be fences off to protect the path users?
- Please confirm the fence between the Mills complex and the GreenWay will remain.
- Please retain the logs from trees already cut down to use as habitat piles in Waratah Mills and for terracing at the Davis Street Side.
- The Artist impressions has little resemblance to the plan.
- Will the retaining wall which separates the carpark from the Bushcare site remain?
- Will the wing walls supporting the tunnel be the width of the remaining abutment or will it be planted?
- Move "Way finding" from Waratah Mills Units car park as it may cause confusion for those who do not know the path well.
- Making the path meander through the site will save more Bushcare, will reduce speeding by bike users and improve the experience.

#### Gadigal reserve

- We ask that the area behind the covered path (opposite the bat habitat/cave) be left as weedy thicket as it provides an important safe haven for our small bird community.
- IWEG is concerned that the movement of machinery onto the site from Governor Cres, along the existing path, may cause unintentional damage to the site
- Ask that the original path on the western side of the canal be narrowed to allow for more plantings and greater bio-diversity. That this path be converted to crushed sandstone.

#### Lewisham West

- Wetland is this site to be fenced off? It will be difficult to retain any bio-diversity (plantings and wildlife) on the site if not, as it will be difficult to keep dogs out. The design seems imply a path half way around the wetland. Does natural turf mean native grasses or lawn?
- Is there an access path from the new building at 120C Old Canterbury Rd to the Light Rail station?

#### Submission on GreenWay Draft Design Plans

#### May, 2023

This submission has been prepared on behalf of the Waratah Mills Owners Corporation by the Waratah Mills Strata Committee, the Waratah Mills GreenWay Working Group and the Waratah Mills Community Garden Group.

The Waratah Mills Owners Corporation supports the GreenWay and wants it to succeed. It is an ambitious and necessary project to address the acute shortage of green space in the inner west and the need for safe pedestrian walkways for people of all ages and safe cycleways.

Inner West Council is to be commended for their continued efforts to secure sufficient funds to turn the GreenWay vision into a reality.

#### Waratah Mills Specific Feedback on GreenWay Draft Design Plan

There are still four key areas where the Owners Corporation and our residents want to see changes to the proposed design, where further information is required to clarify the design intent and where our Owners Corporation and our residents want further consultation and communication with Council and with the relevant contractors before construction commences. Several of these issues were raised at the Johnson Park and other drop-in sessions by our residents and we acknowledge the feedback on many of our queries provided at the drop-in session or by email from the GreenWay Engagement Officer.

Our comments in this section focus on the design features set out in Maps LA-210 and LA-211 for the Davis Street and Terry Rd sections of the GreenWay.

#### Issue 1: No Side Path through Waratah Mills Easement and Permanent Closure of Davis Street Carpark Gates to General Public GreenWay Users on Safety Grounds

Waratah Mills residents and the Owner Corporation have consistently advocated for a tunnel under Davis Street as the only safe GreenWay path exit from the Waratah Mills bushcare site for cyclists, pedestrians, and other GreenWay users.

Our arguments (summarised again in Appendix 1) and supported by the GreenWay MasterPlan Route Options Analysis, were accepted, and confirmed in the Final MasterPlan by the decision of Inner West Council on August 2018. It is pleasing to see that the Draft Design Plan (LA-210) and artists impression show the Davis Street Tunnel as the exit route.

# Despite this, the Owners Corporation is extremely concerned that the Design Plan continues to show the use of a small side path from the Waratah Mills car park easement and through the current locked gates with steps down the slight slope to the bushcare site.

The Final Greenway Master Plan approved by Inner West Council in August 2018 supported the Tunnel option and rejected the use of the Waratah Mills carpark easement option on safety grounds. This makes the continued use of Waratah Mills easement for the public to enter/exit the GreenWay unnecessary and in conflict with the Council resolution.

#### Use of the side path for general public access will remain an accident waiting to happen.

Any entry/exit via the easement is still unsafe, especially because random users coming through or entering Waratah Mills from the side path will surprise owners exiting the Waratah Mills carpark

which has no line of sight to the easement gates. At weekends, when the Visitors Carparks are full, and during the working week, when visitors and tradesmen use the Visitors carpark, casual users will not anticipate cyclists or random pedestrians crossing their path.

We have raised our concerns at the retention of this side path with Council in our submissions on the *GreenWay Draft Concept Design Plan* and the *In-Corridor Works Environmental Factors Report* and they have been ignored. The only response from Council officers defending the retention of the side path has been to restate the purpose of the easement as pedestrian and cyclists access and to suggest that the most likely users will be Waratah Mills residents entering the GreenWay via our carpark. This argument fails on several grounds.

- Because an easement permits a use, it is does not necessarily mean that it must be used for all the designation purposes. There are various easements in or adjacent to apartment blocks in the Central Links and Southern Links that have not been used as part of the final GreenWay route design because of route changes and /or because of sensible concerns raised by the relevant Owners Corporations.
- The Waratah Mills carpark easement has been closed with locked gates to prevent entry to the bushcare site by the public or by residents since the building was redeveloped and opened in 2003. The easement has always been made available to the Inner West Environment Group, Council and Light Rail maintenance staff as needed for 20 years. This has become the expected use of the carpark easement and this approach should be continued.

### The other argument raised in Council responses is that the easement entry to the GreenWay will likely be primarily used by Waratah Mills residents. THIS IS NOT TRUE.

We have canvassed our resident community on all GreenWay planning matters since the Draft MasterPlan was released and held numerous resident meetings, encouraged residents to attend key workshops, undertaken mail outs and one to one conversations, especially with our many active cyclists, to gauge resident opinion.

- There is consensus amongst our residents that the easement should not be used as a GreenWay entry or exit on safety and security grounds and because it poses an uninsurable risk if an accident occurs.
- Our residents plan to join and exit the GreenWay path at the main entry point in Terry Rd.
- Pedestrians from the immediate neighbourhood or alighting at Waratah Mills Light Rail Stop can walk across the Waratah Mill campus entering down steps at Davis Street and using a pedestrian only easement past our buildings that comes out at Terry Rd.
- These factors mean the side path is functionally redundant, still poses a safety risk and will only add unnecessary costs to the project.

#### Waratah Mills Recommendation on the Side Path and Appropriate Use of the Easement

- 1. The side path shown connecting the Waratah Mills Carpark easement to the GreenWay should not be used by the public to enter or exit the GreenWay on safety grounds.
- 2. The gates connecting the GreenWay and Waratah Mills bushcare site and the Waratah Mills carpark should remain in place and be locked to the public, including cyclists and pedestrians, who can access the GreenWay path via the Terry Rd entry.

- **3.** Access to the easement for IWEG and Council/Council contractors will remain available for bushcare site and GreenWay maintenance as it has been for 20 years.
- 4. Contractor access should be subject to the hours of work rules set out in the Environmental Factors Report and undertaken with proper notice and consultation with the Strata Committee and the Strata Manager.
- 5. A proposed Way Finding Station shown on the Draft Design Plan at the locked gates becomes redundant and should not proceed. Instead a Way Finding Station should be included in the design as part of the Terry Rd entrance.
- 6. The Draft Design Plan appeared to shorten the length of the board walk compared to the Greenway Masterplan. Following questions from residents, Council Officers have confirmed that the board walk will continue to a point adjacent to the Davis Street carpark gates. This is supported.
- 7. The current chain wire fence along the eastern Waratah Mills property boundary should remain in place for safety and privacy reasons. While it is not clear on the Draft Design Plan, we understand from Council officers that the boundary fences between the Greenway/bushcare site and our private property will not be removed. This is supported.

# Issue 2: Restore Waratah Mills Bushcare Site with diverse plant choices designed in partnership with Waratah Mills Residents, IWEG and Council to Re-Green the GreenWay, restore the ecological values of the bushcare site and provide light spill, noise and heat buffers for Waratah Mills.

The GreenWay has been promoted to the community as a chance to increase green spaces for recreation and community use and overcome well known deficits in tree cover and parklands in the Inner West Council area and Dulwich Hill.

The *Draft Environmental Factors Report* indicated that **32% of the current tree cover or 232 trees** will be removed for GreenWay construction with a further 106 trees likely to be impacted by path construction. Only 396 trees or 54% of the current trees along the Greenway route will be retained.

Waratah Mills Owners has consistently recommended that Council have a proactive revegetation plan to re-green the GreenWay immediately post construction, especially in the Central and Southern Links, where established bushcare sites and significant areas of remnant bush such as the Gadigal Reserve and plantings adjoining major apartment complexes will be destroyed or severally impacted.

The GreenWay construction will seriously impact on the Waratah Mills Bushcare site even if the contractors use light touch construction techniques and install a pre-fabricated raised path as indicated in the Draft Design maps and advice from Council Officers.

The removal of existing trees and native shrubs from the Waratah Mills bushcare site, which is now clearly visible in the red circles on Maps 210 and 211 for the first time, will affect our residents overlooking the Light Rail Line due to increase in noise and light spillage from the GreenWay path itself and from the Light Rail Line. Some Hopper residents will have the Greenway Path less than a metre from their apartment wall.

The same or worse impacts will be felt at Williams Parade and other areas immediately adjoining the GreenWay path in Southern Links.

We note that the Draft Design Plan is the first occasion that any designs for the GreenWay have shown clearly trees and shrubs to be removed and provide an 'indicative ecological replanting scheme'. We applaud Council for providing this information and inviting comment at this time.

We note the references in the Draft Design to "privacy screening planting to be considered along the boundary to adjacent properties" (Map 210 and 211) which is consistent with the suggestions made by Waratah Mills residents in the past. We also note that some of the plantings are placed to overshadow or diffuse the light spill for the 5m pole lands that will light the GreenWay path. We also note the design suggestion (Map210) to replant the Davis St embankment after major tree removal for tunnel construction. The removal of major trees on the embankment has already occurred at Waratah Mills.

These are positive suggestions and reflect the views of our residents and the Waratah Mills Owners Corporation in broad terms.

Despite this, Waratah Mills believes there is still insufficient detail about the planting schema, the maturity of the plantings proposed in key locations, the ecological restoration planting to support biodiversity and the proposed plant choices and locations to ensure noise, light and heat abatement for Waratah Mills to support the scheme in its current form.

#### Waratah Mills Recommendation: Revegetation and Ecological Restoration

We believe that **Re-Greening the GreenWay** must be a priority across the GreenWay but specifically in the Southern and Central Links given the tree clearing and adverse ecological impacts of GreenWay path construction evident in the Draft Design.

In the Southern Links and at Waratah Mills we recommend the following design principles be adopted:

- All GreenWay impacted buildings/apartments must be screened by appropriate height and ecologically diverse planting to control noise and light spill from the Greenway, assist with heat control and support climate change adaption.
- Advanced plantings of appropriate screening plants **must be used to screen more exposed buildings** e.g. Hopper and Silo at Waratah Mills and impacted Williams Pde properties, from GreenWay light spill and noise.
- The Bushcare site should be planted with a mix of tall trees and shrubs and a broad mix of plant types to promote biodiversity and habit. The artist's impression appears very repetitious, using a narrow and standardised plant range and more like a parkland or walkway planting than a restored bushcare site.
- Replanting/ restoration should commence immediately following construction.

### Waratah Mills Recommendation: Codesign with Residents, IWEG, Contractor and Council staff to Confirm the Final Planting Scheme Be Construction

Waratah Mills recommends that Council facilitate a site-specific co-design process with directly affected resident groups to finalise the planting scheme and landscape design for the GreenWay and bushcare sites **before revegetation** is implemented by the Council Contractor. The co-design process at Waratah Mills and Davis Street should involve the Waratah Mills Owners Corporation, the Inner West Environment Group and the Contractor as well as Council staff.

This input will ensure the best outcomes for resident amenity and effective revegetation and ecological restoration are achieved and provide useful input for the Contractor.

#### Issue 3: Drainage improvements at Terry Road

The *GreenWay Concept Design Plan* and Associated Technical Reports and the *Draft Design Plan* indicate that the proposed drainage improvements, including the new enlarged drain and wider and deeper swale/s on the GreenWay near Terry Road, should assist with storm water management and GreenWay drainage. This will hopefully address the severe storm water overflows into private properties, including the Hopper carpark, that are consistently occurring in Terry Road after high rainfall events.

The Waratah Mills Owners Corporation have spent very large sums to take all necessary steps on our property to manage and redirect overflow storm water and prevent lift flooding and water ingress to the Hopper carpark.

Council's efforts to address these drainage problems as part of the GreenWay development are welcome and supported by Waratah Mills owners and residents.

#### Waratah Mills Recommendation: Drainage

We have been advised by Council staff that the GreenWay contractor dealing with the drainage issue is confident that they can achieve significant improvements to stormwater management as part of the GreenWay works.

We request the opportunity for our Strata Manager and Chair or nominee of the Strata Committee to meet with the relevant contractor to be shown the plans and to brief us on the solution.

This will enable the Owners Corporation to provide feedback on our actual experience of the flooding events and to consider any additional risk mitigation measures that may be needed in the future.

#### Issue 4: Council Liaison and Contractor Communication during Construction

In our comment on the *In-Corridor Works Environmental Factors Report* we noted the range of construction management issues that will impact on Waratah Mills including traffic management in Terry Rd where the major site yard etc will be based, hours of work issues and advance notice and communication to our residents.

### Waratah Mills Recommendation: Communication with Waratah Mills before and during construction

Proactive communication from Council staff and the Contractors, and compliance with statutory notification periods before key works commence, will be essential to enable residents, especially those who work from home, to plan during GreenWay construction and maintain cordial relations with the contractors.

#### **Appendix: Easement Safety and Security Issues**

#### **Safety Risks of Easement**

A GreenWay exit through the carpark will pose an unacceptable safety risk for all GreenWay users and for Waratah Mills residents.

It will **intentionally** put pedestrians of all ages and growing numbers of commuter and recreational cyclists expected to use the GreenWay directly in harm's way on a narrow path in the face of vehicles entering and exiting Waratah Mills driveway and resident carpark.

The Final GreenWay MasterPlan said that 90 cyclists and pedestrians would use the GreenWay in the morning/evening peak hour in 2021. That is **1.5 cyclists or walkers through the driveway every minute ... and the numbers are predicted to double or treble within 10 years!** 

It will be impossible for residents to enter or exit Waratah Mills at peak times without interacting with users on the GreenWay path and slow speeds will contribute to traffic backing up on Davis Street and queuing in the Waratah Mills carpark or driveway.

Sightlines for GreenWay users entering the carpark are poor and the steep slope of the driveway will force cyclists to slow down or dismount, further disrupting traffic flow. Mirrors and signage will not significantly reduce these hazards as GreenWay traffic grows.

Resident security will also be directly affected as GreenWay users will be able to step off the path and have unfettered access to the Mill and Annex buildings carpark when the carpark door opens and closes.

These factors represent Council imposed uninsurable risks for Waratah Mills Owners Corporation and our residents as well as avoidable safety concerns for GreenWay users.

#### GreenWay MasterPlan recommended Davis Street Tunnel for good reasons

The Final GreenWay MasterPlan Report and the Route Options Analysis agreed with the residents' assessment and described the obvious hazards in the following terms and recommended the Davis Street tunnel as follows:

The key limitation for this option is the use of the easement in the driveway of 10-14 Terry Road. Although this easement was put in place with the future GreenWay in mind, it has several limitations:

- The driveway is steep
- The driveway has a tight bend and sightlines around the corner are poor

- The defined easement is relatively narrow and hugs inside of the bend, where the corner is tightest and sightlines are worst

- The driveway is shared with vehicle traffic and there is not enough space to separate different users (there is an existing pedestrian route adjacent to the driveway, but it includes a set of steps)

MasterPlan Route Options Analysis Recommendation: If the GreenWay is constructed on the western side of the light rail corridor to the south of Davis Street, then the preferred option here is a tunnel under Davis Street. Given the limitations associated with the at-grade crossing (steep driveway, potential conflict with cars, awkward alignment with pedestrian crossing), a tunnel is likely to be a relatively high priority here. Thus, option 1 is the higher priority option for this location. Final GreenWay MasterPlan Route Options Analysis July 2018 Page 43.

We are the appointed Strata Managers for the above Strata Plan 48676, 30 Unit Owners that form part of the DP 270052 Community Association, a total of 132 Unit Owners at 1.2.3 Williams Parade Dulwich Hill.

Please see the following feedback and questions from our Strata Plan regarding the Greenway.

#### **SECURITY & SAFETY**

The extensive GreenWay clearing of the embankment behind 1-3 Williams Parade on April 1-2 removed the eastern boundary barrier exposing our entire complex to easy access and entry from the light rail corridor below.

What immediate barrier is proposed for protection of persons and property onsite? What permanent fencing/barriers are proposed that are appropriate for security, safety, privacy, light and amenity on our eastern boundary?

#### PRIVACY

The construction works and the completed GreenWay cycleway and walkway are within a few metres of windows and balconies of 82 apartments at 3 Williams Pde. How soon can planting privacy screening be installed on the eastern boundary?

#### CONSULTATION

How can 1-3 Williams Pde be confident in the conduct of this major infrastructure project given the lack of consultation and notification provided to us prior to April 1-2 extensive clearing behind our complex? When will there be Consultation with 1-3 Williams Pde on Security, Safety and Privacy?

#### **DUST & NOISE**

Recent clearing works carried out on 1-2 April were intensely noisy and cast brush waste etc over the common property. What appropriate protections will be installed to protect residents and the community from impacts of dust, noise, and debris in coming months, during construction from August 2023 and on completion of the GreenWay in 2024-05?

Works will certainly impact Marsbridge 3 Williams Parade north end? Will contractors be required to conduct Dilapidation Reports on buildings and structures closest to tunnel site to benchmark cracking etc?

Guarantee that no more trees on or within 1-3 Williams PDE boundary will be felled

#### **REPLANTING PLAN**

How is this to be conducted and when will it commence? Since the eastern boundary was stripped of all vegetation and biodiversity how can the 'proposed' range of just 15 kinds of planting species be adequate?

#### MAINTAINING NEW PLANTINGS TO ENSURE THEY SURVIVE

What guarantee is there for residents that resourcing will be adequate to support the extensive replanting needed to meet previous 'green' 'biodiversity' commitments of GreenWay project over the whole of the south section between Constitution and New Canterbury Rd bridges. How will this project ensure that replanting regime is planned, conducted, and adequately resourced to maintain new plantings so that the site recovers to give amenity to residents/GreenWay users.

#### **RESTORATION OF BIODIVERSITY TO SUPPORT BIRDS AND WILDLIFE HABITAT**

The Mayor of Inner West Council and Councillor Drury have said that maintaining biodiversity is as important as constructing the GreenWay cycleway and walkway. How is this strong value for Inner West residents and communities to be upheld and demonstrated beyond possibly neglected 'green landscaping'. How will the site be supported in recovery and in perpetuity by qualified bushcare maintenance contractors?

#### Greenway Draft Design Plan :Submission of

#### **Greenway Path Location.**

The Draft Design provides for a side path from the GreenWay through the Waratah Mills Cark Park to Davis Street. Ancillary issues include the proposed removal of the locked gates for which access is currently limited and a way finding station at the boundary intersection between our car park and the GreenWay. **This submission strongly opposes the proposed side path.** 

This submission opposes the side path from the Greenway because:

- The GreenWay route options for the WM Bushcare site have been the subject of discussion and analysis and decisions and recommendations of Council. See a. IWC Greenway Masterplan Decision of 14 August 2018.b The GreenWay Masterplan\* (Appendix C Greenway Route Options Assessment Report, Section10 Davis Street Crossing<sup>1</sup>. To my knowledge the only Greenway path location proposal adopted by the report and decision of Council was the Davis Street Tunnel. This submission argues that the Davis Street Tunnel option made any other potential path option redundant. The wide variety of issues, especially safety, have not changed and do not warrant a side path. Such a proposal is an accident waiting to happen. An added concern for residents is increased insurance premiums and potential litigation between our Owners and Residents Corporation and Council.
- 2. The Draft Design proposal is contrary to the Route Options Framework Assessment Criteria which provided:
  - (a) Walkable and rideable by all (i.e., the route needs to be safe with smooth transitions and gentle grades} The route should facilitate a design which minimizes conflict between different users. Ideally it is relatively direct with minimal stopping,) ideally it is relatively direct with minimal stopping and starting, offering visual interest and places to pause.
  - (b) The Council decision included at point c "community consultation and communication Plans which must detail the approach to resident input ... and recognizes the value IWC places on appropriately increasing the say local residents can have about the area." There has been no resident input to the Greenway Draft Design side path proposal.
- 3. This submission argues that because of the decision/s to proceed with the Davis Street Tunnel,
  - The proposed Wayfinding station is redundant and should be deleted.
  - The current locked gates separating the Davis Street carpark and the Bushcare site should remain in place with access continuing for a limited range of parties e.g., light rail maintenance/emergency personnel, bushcare site maintainers.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Option 2 of the analysis was the use of an existing easement through the WM car park. It noted "the key limitation for the option is the use of the easement in the driveway of 1-14 Terry Road. Although the easement was put in place with the future Greenway in mind. It has several limitations. The driveway is steep, the driveway has a tight bend and sightlines around the corner are poor, the defined easement is narrow and hugs the inside of the bend where the corner is tightest and sightlines worst and the driveway is shared with vehicle traffic and there is not enough space to separate different users."

- The draft design plan indicates the raised boardwalk is shorter through the bushcare site than proposed in the Greenway Master Plan. Discussions and correspondence with the IWC Engagement Team have resulted in affirmation of the boardwalk length as proposed in the GreenWay Masterplan.
- The difficulty in physically reading the Draft Design Plan documentation raises a query as to whether the current chain link fence separating WM from the bushcare site will continue. The Engagement Team has confirmed to residents that the current practice shall remain in place.

#### Ecological Restoration for the WM bushcare site.

For WM residents our Bushcare site is our "**local green lungs"** providing residents with visual amenity, separation from the light rail line, diverse plantings, biodiversity reduces noise and has been maintained by IWEG for many years. It is one of the oldest bushcare sites in the InnerWest. WM residents have an active Community Garden Group.

The Greenway Masterplan acknowledges the importance of bushcare sites which are "**important places for community involvement in ecological restoration.**" The severity of the Greenway construction impact on the WM Bushcare site was recognized in the Masterplan by providing additional area for revegetation in Johnson Park as an offset and the creation of a raised boardwalk through much of the WM bushcare site. This has a number of benefits including minimization of impacts on the remaining WM Bushcare site and promoting biodiversity.

This submission argues there is a range of individual residents' concerns that need to be taken into consideration. For example, the GreenWay path will pass within a metre of some Hopper Building resident's apartments. The Draft Plan refers to a privacy screening for these residents. However, what if revegetation commenced in 3 or 5 years into the future?

For WM Residents the Draft Design Plan is unfortunately very thin in detail. Artist's impressions do not address the many questions posed by the lack of detail and the general comments accompanying the artists impression which include references to Ecological Restoration Area and privacy screening for residents. Both are important concepts but as always "the devil is in the detail."

This submission argues that a practical community consultation which increases the say of residents and should be underpinned by co-design principles which reflect a joint participatory model between WM residents, IWEG and IWC based on:

- Consultation with WM residents and IWEG before construction commences about ways to minimize construction damage to our Bushcare site and use of machinery/hand tools which minimizes as much as possible ecological and biodiversity damage.
- Discussion and agreement between residents about a greater range of plant species and mature plantings than those which have been suggested by the Council.
- The immediate restoration of the WM Bushcare site once construction of the Greenway path through the Bushcare site is completed. In a number of senses this point raises the elephant in the room: the question of what are the financial costs and priorities that are being pursued by Council in this area of the Green Way Missing Links Draft Design Plan? WW residents have not seen any reference to financial data since the adoption of the GreenWay Masterplan. Residents know in general that the history of the GreenWay has seen continuing financial comprises, cuts, delays and lengthening of time frames.
- The GreenWay Master Plan in 8.1 noted:

- a) The current funding prioritizes the missing links, that short term implementation priorities needed to reflect he goals of the funding organizations and that funding priorities were categorized as Priority A, Priority B -Seek funding for these elements as the next priority, target 2026 implementation, Category C target 2031 completion.
- b) The Table at P131 of the Masterplan referred to a number of precincts and their A, B and C priorities. The Dulwich Hill Parks Precinct include a number of Priority A "a portion of the proposed revegetation and Priority B "remaining portion of revegetation."
- WM residents have been unable to obtain contemporaneous costings for the Dulwich Hill Parks Precinct, the information guarded by *"Commercial in Confidence"* considerations. app In general terms residents are aware of the increased Greenway Funding announced in information bulletins to IWC residents. Unfortunately, the Draft Design Plan sheds no light on financial costs and priorities. It is a major missing link of the Draft Plan and needs to be forcefully and openly addressed by IWC in the interests of accountability and transparency.

This Submission has outlined a number of principles for the Ecological Restoration of the WM Bushcare site. This Submission requests the Final Design Plan adopt the principles that are set out herein.

#### **Davis Street Tunnel Art**

This submission puts forward the suggestion that the artwork for the tunnel use the 2023 centenary celebration of Waratah Mills as its focus.

The 100-year history of the site exemplifies the evolution of the history of Dulwich Hill from a once significant industrial manufacturing site served by the metropolitan goods line to an early example of an architectural award-winning industrial heritage site conversion into residential complex now serviced by a former goods line n converted to a light rail passenger service.

In addressing the industrial heritage history of the site this submission suggests there are a range of reference points for heritage interpretation that can be pursued including: the buildings, the machinery used and the workers who enabled the site to function as a successful industrial enterprise. There are many potential sources of historical information and interpretation available: Councils own extensive historical records, former employees of the Waratah Four Mills, the Marrickville Heritage Society, the Australian Railway Historical Society and the Strata Committee of the WM Owners and Residents Corporation.

#### Johnson Park

The park is well used by WM residents for a variety of recreational purposes and residents have shown a keen interest in the development of the Johnson Park Masterplan.

The Draft Design Plan notes there is a separate Masterplan for the Park. This submission notes the shared Greenway path through the park raises issues which may require addressing by the Draft Design Plan.

The GreenWay Masterplan included a number of comments relevant to the Greenway and Jonson Park including at **7.5 Dulwich Hill Parks Precinct** " an upgraded path through Johnson Park , including modifications to minimize conflict...... and at 8.1 Introduction " Note that Dulwich Hill parks are the subject of a separate Masterplan and most works are within these parks are

excluded from the cost estimates here. However, works considered essential to the GreenWay delivery are included."

The Precinct costing table for the Dulwich Parks Precinct included as within Priority A *"works within Johnson Park and modify playground near path.* \* (\*pending community engagement)

This submission requests that finalized GreenWay Design Plan include those items where there is an overlap between the GreenWay and Johnson Park as set out in the GreenWay Masterplan.

#### **Terry Road Drainage**

The volume of stormwater that accumulates in Terry Road following significant rain event has on a number of occasions flowed into the WM Hopper Building causing considerable damage to the budlings infrastructure which has resulted in major financial costs for the WM Owners and Residents Corporation.

The Draft Design Plan includes reference to drainage works and the expansion of swales to address the issue. Unfortunately, the diagrams, without an accompanying explanation, do not allow residents to judge the success or otherwise of the proposed drainage works. Resident Interaction with the IWC Engagement Team suggests that the contactor, TTW engineering company, will upgrade pipes and flow rates and that there is optimism that the GreenWay project and ancillary works will successfully address this long-standing problem.

This submission requests the Council to provide technical details/expert opinions as to how the proposed drainage works will address the Terry Road storm water/drainage Issues.

#### Dear Ms Jansen

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the development of this important 'open' space. I have addressed the issues by map number.

Comments on the proposed works on the Greenway corridor

#### General

I found the visual information on which I am to base my comments confusing. The artist impressions often omitted key features and the maps lacked pertinent surrounding detail so that I found it hard to locate where I was, and the print too small and faint to read with any ease on a laptop. There was also a paucity of detail as to what new works are being planned and how they integrated with existing features.

Calling this a 'greenway' is a bit of a misnomer, since the design emphasis is on concrete pedestrian and cycle paths through planted out verges. However I would like to see the biodiversity protected to the largest extent possible within these constraints.

I would like to see the knock on effects from the paths to be addressed sensitively. Lighting needs to be designed to minimise negative impacts on wildlife, and paths located to minimise their intrusion into planted areas. In some places human access needs to be restricted.

Public art and rest areas invite path users to stop and take stock of their surroundings. They also add to the human impact on the 'green' aspect of the corridor. They should be located near existing built structures and incorporated into them. The surfaces of infrastructure elements can become the canvases and platforms for art installations. Not only would this turn visual liabilities into assets, it would free up funds for necessary maintenance of the green spaces which chronically suffer from lack of budget.

The choice of Gartner Rose to oversee the construction of green spaces is odd given their expertise lies in buildings and built environments. Getting them to work out how to put a tunnel under a road is one thing, but they have no credentials when it comes to protecting biodiversity. I strongly object to this company being given the contract to manage the natural spaces.

There are two types of plantings identified: 'ecological restoration' and 'mass general'. Without any details of what these mean, I would like to see a large variety of species incorporated, based on the original vegetation communities of the area, to complement what is left. The last thing we need is more swathes of Dianellas and Lomandras. To ensure this happens there needs to be appropriate consultation in the selection of plant species and an ongoing financial commitment to have these areas managed by professionals.

The scope of works should include the removal of the large invasive trees currently growing throughout the greenway, particularly Phoenix Palms (*Phoenix canariensis*) and Celtis (*Celtis sinensis*), both of which are proliferating at the expense of native trees and offering little in the way of alternate habitat values.

#### Drawing LA-202

The transfer of the path to the north side of the canal provides the opportunity to remove the current path on the south side between Parramatta Road and Haigh Street, and restore it to natural vegetation. Easy alternate access is available metres away down Frenchs Lane.

Sydney Water could access its infrastructure from the new path. This would partially compensate for other areas where vegetation will be removed to make way for paths.

#### Drawing LA-203

The vegetation around the microbat site is known habitat for increasingly rare small birds. This vegetation should be left intact, even though it contains a lot of weed species. The birds don't care so long as it provides food and shelter.

Heavy vehicles are expected to use the access road from the Gadigal Reserve carpark to carry out works along the canal. Contracts need to stipulate that the plants in the reserve are not to be damaged in the process.

#### Drawing LA-204

The shared concrete path should be located as close as possible to the light rail infrastructure. This would diminish the proliferation of weeds that the light rail managers cant find a budget to control, and maximise the width of the vegetated area, thereby increasing the possibility of biodiversity.

#### Drawing LA-206

The wetland needs to be fenced off to protect the native fauna and flora from introduced animals and people.

#### Drawing LA-207

Where the raised section of the walk ends the path should keep as close as possible to the private walled side, to maximise the possibility of biodiversity occurring.

#### Drawings LA-208, 209

The proposed path over Old Canterbury Road is a preferred option to creating a tunnel under the road, which would destroy an important remnant of habitat vegetation.

#### Drawing LA-210

Public access through the Waratah Mills carpark could be dangerous, as drivers don't have good visibility on the underground parking ramp.

#### Drawing LA-211

Path south of Terry Road should be located next to the boundary wall. Extra sensitivity required to locate and construct the path through the established bushcare site.

#### Drawing LA -213

What will the lighting feature? Why place a rest stop where there is slightly more width of green spaced?

1.Grateful that the Council want to work in this area to maintain and improve the bio- diversity of the area.

2. Meetings be held with major stakeholders 2/3 weeks before construction begins so that everyone understands the work to be carried out and the impact on the neighbouring residents and Bushcare sites.

3.Meeting with Bushcare representatives, Urban Ecology, and Gartner Rose to try to save as many plantings as possible.

4. Working hours to be confined to Mon-Friday 7.00am-3.30pm and 8am-1pm on Saturdays.

5. Wayfinding also include direction to local shopping strips, interesting historical and First Nations history via QR codes.

6. Aboriginal and Torres Strait people be included and consulted on all points of the work.

7. A new Urban ecology officer be appointed to solely look after the Greenway ensuring biodiversity is protected and enhanced. Could this be a First Nation person?

8. Full protection of Hercules Parkland remnant Creek and its bio-diversity.

#### **GreenWay Submission on Design and Construct Documents**

I have lived in Dulwich Hill since 1987 (37 years). I have been involved in Bushcare and bird surveys for more than 20 years. Through IWEG I have been able to gain a number of small grants to help improve the GreenWay and encouraging native plants and birdscaping in our gardens.

#### General comments:

- I am disappointed in the lack of detail in the design plans
- I strongly urge that meetings be held with local stakeholders (strata managers, strata committee representatives and IWEG) 2-3 weeks before construction begin in or next to their communities so everyone really understands the work to be carried out and the impact on neighbouring residents and Bushcare sites. Misunderstandings can be sorted out and any miss steps can be prevented.
- Signage be placed in areas where construction is about to begin with detailed description of work
- Written notification sent to residents, be delivered in a more timely manner and contain greater detail so residents aren't taken by surprise or distressed.
- Meetings to be held on site with Bushcare representatives, Urban Ecology and Gartner Rose to try and save as much of the plantings as possible at Hercules Parklands, Waratah Mills and Johnson Park.
- Security fencing, dust and noise mitigation be put in place immediately to protect adjoining residents.
- Residents to have a point of contact with Gartner Rose construction crew in case of any day-today issues or emergencies.
- What experience does Gartner Rose having in building and maintaining bio-diversity
- Will there be emergency phones situated at various points along the path?
- Is some form of smarting lighting being, used that dimes when there is no movement close by, as is used in parts of the Cooks River bike path, Strathfield end.
- That appropriate signage be used either on the path or on signs to encourage kindness, respect and good manners by users eg ringing of bells, no exceeding speed limits, giving way to pedestrians.

#### Maintaining Bio-diversity - A GreenWay not a Grey Way

- Meetings to be held on site with Bushcare representatives, Urban Ecology and Gartner Rose to try and save as much of the plantings as possible at Johnson Park, Waratah Mills and Hercules Parkland.
- A new Urban ecology officer be appointed to solely look after the GreenWay ensuring biodiversity is protected and enhanced. Current staff are far too over committed to take on extra duties.
- Employ a suitably qualified gardener to keep the whole of the GreenWay plantings (outside of Bushcare sites) in good condition, weed free and plants replaced as needed. This person report to Urban Ecology not Parks.
- The GreenWay needs a complex variety of plants, shrubs and trees to improve bio-diversity. We need plants from both STIF, Coastal Sandstone Freshwater and Coastal Swamp communities. We need at least 60 species from each community. At the Arlington grove Complex in Grove St Dulwich Hill, Council required them to plant 50 different species in their native garden adjoining the GreenWay in a very small area. The GreenWay area under construction, while contain many more species, while some are weeds, they provide habitat and food sources for small birds,

reptiles, small mammals, and insects. Not replacing with the same diversity will decrease the bio-diversity value of the GreenWay.

- The contractor employed to plant and maintain the new plantings to hold relevant bushcare/bush regeneration qualifications. Weeding to be done by hand to ensure native grasses and small ground covers are not removed by mistake. Regular audits are conducted on this work. Contracts be put in place for maintenance of the native vegetation in perpetuity or by a staff employed specifically for this job.
- Encourage and engage home owners close the GreenWay to take an interest in the planting, biodiversity and help maintain them.
- Maintaining biodiversity especially for small birds requires width as well and length.
- Seeking assurances that if funds run low, the budget for revegetation will not be cut.

#### Hercules Parkland

- I welcome the change to the route of the path to greatly reduce the impact on the creek. It is concerning however that the design maps don't appear to show the start of the creek and where the path will cross the creek
- A bridge to replace the cement pathway over the Creek line. The bridge be built perpendicular to the creek line to minimize the impact and erosion on the creek line and its banks. Cement has a very high pH (> 9) and will leach alkaline water into the creek over time, affecting the frogs, insect life and the plants growing along the edge of the creek.
- Please leave a large area of thicket/weedy area fenced off to retain habitat for small birds, insects, reptiles, and small mammals.
- Is the creek line fenced off from the path, and how close to the path? If not why not. A fence will save the plantings from unintentional damage from dogs, users cutting corners or mischief makers. Large areas of plantings by the City of Sydney and Sydney Water at Federal Park and Jubilee Park Glebe native plantings are now fenced off. A fence as close as possible to the path will help anchor the bio-diversity of the area. This is/ will be the only large wild area along the GreenWay and which has width as well as depth which is vital for small birds, mammals, and reptiles to feel safe in and flourish.
- Crushed sandstone must be used for weed capping and not crushed granite.
- IWEG bird survey group urgently call for a bird survey in the next month, to confirm if any small birds. IWEG is happy to help undertake this survey.

#### Constitution to New Canterbury Rd

- Can you confirm that no more trees will be removed from the section.
- Privacy screening a must.
- Urgently need Security fencing, dust and noise mitigation put in place immediately to protect adjoining residents. It is very easy for mischief makers to now duck along the Light rail line in the shadow of the overhead bridges from Arlington or Dulwich Grove and up onto the cleared land and onto the balconies of 1-3 Williams Parade.
- Retaining Wall at Constitution Rd. Will this be on Residents property? Will it extend to the carpark or just to a shallow depth shadowing the new path? How high will it be?
- Is there a raise in gradient between Johnson Park and New Canterbury Road?
- How high off the ground is the raised path to be?

• What water run off mitigation will be put in place.

#### Johnson Park

- I was very disappointed at the clearing of the guerrilla garden adjoining Johnson Park stairs as the area does not appear to be needed for the tunnel works area and was not mentioned in the notification sent to residents. This area is now very quickly being taken over by Caster oil plants which emerge once the soil is disturbed.
- The artists impression bears no resemblance to the detailed design. There are no retaining walls on the plans.

#### Davis St to Johnson Park

- I welcomes the suggestion that the building of the raised path can be done while fencing, with webbing, running along the length of the path separating the path and the Bushcare and stopping unnecessary damage to plantings.
- I feel very strongly that the gates into the Waratah Mills car park **must** remain, be locked, and still be used as an easement access by and for maintenance, emergency access and by the Bushcare groups. The line of site to the right for cars exiting the underground carpark is very poor due to the large hedge and there is a blind spot for cars entering the carpark from Davis Street. It will be very difficult to see a small child should they break away from their family. Local residents can easily access the GreenWay from Davis St and Terry St. A third entrance/exit within a few hundred metres is not needed or necessary.
- Move the path as close as possible to the wall of 5 Terry Street to maximise the amount of Bushcare that can be saved.
- What plans are in place for the very large stormwater grate opposite Waratah car park exit? Will this be fences off to protect the path users?
- Is there a gradient from the Light rail side of the tunnel to the Bushcare site
- Please confirm the fence between the Mills complex and the GreenWay will remain.
- Please retain the logs from trees already cut down to use as habitat piles in Waratah Mills and for terracing at the Davis Street Side.
- The Artist impressions has little resemblance to the plan.
- Will the retaining wall which separates the carpark from the Bushcare site remain?
- Will the wing walls supporting the tunnel be the width of the remaining abutment or will it be planted?
- Move "Way finding" from Waratah Mills Units car park as it may cause confusion for those who do not know the path well.
- Making the path meander through the site will save more Bushcare, will reduce speeding by bike users and improve the experience.
- IWEG asks that a 1m high fence be erected within the Bushcare plantings, 1 m from the path. This will not interfere with bike riders and will help to deter people and dogs from jumping off the path.

#### Gadigal reserve

• We ask that the area behind the covered path (opposite the bat habitat/cave) be left as weedy thicket as it provides an important safe haven for our small bird community.

- I am concerned that the movement of machinery onto the site from Governor Cres, along the existing path, may cause unintentional damage to the site
- Ask that the original path on the western side of the canal be narrowed to allow for more plantings and greater bio-diversity. That this path be converted to crushed sandstone.

#### Lewisham West

- Wetland is this site to be fenced off? It will be difficult to retain any bio-diversity (plantings and wildlife) on the site if not, as it will be difficult to keep dogs out. The design seems imply a path half way around the wetland. Does natural turf mean native grasses or lawn?
- Is there an access path from the new building at 120C Old Canterbury Rd to the Light Rail station?
- Rail heritage at Lewisham West? How will this be saved. It is possible to keep some of the rails in place eg the ones cemented in near the old brick Milling building, similar to what has been done at Carriage works.

#### **Response to the Geenway Missing Links Project**

Q1. I'm very supportive of the plan

Q2. My comments are general and relate to all seven sections

#### **General comments:**

For Acknowledgements of Country, and Urban Forest claims to mean anything the Greenway must be dedicated to the greatest native vegetation diversity of Gadi country. That has to be the priority of the Greenway, along with a safe and attractive pedestrian and bike route.

On the other hand, non native habitat that are refuges for native animals due to lost natural habitat must be maintained.

Fencing off native vegetation areas form bikes, and from people who have no regard for native plants, is essential. There is a need in us humans to possess and control animals and plants we relate strongly with. Native animals aren't conducive to petting so don't rate in peoples minds generally. The tragedy of dead possums left in the street for garbos to dispose of. A dead Ringtail Possum in Chandos St near Pattamatta Rd last week, I was on foot, no camera or car; previously a dead Ringtail in Canterbury Rd near my place, as was a dead Brushtail also nearby before then. So different to the grief for pets.

Nature is messy, native plants aren't meant for topiary and trimming. Their beauty is in their form and how they situate with other native plants. This becomes obvious when a weedy mess in bushland is thinned out to just natives and their aesthetic arrangements. Native animals and native plants have symbiotic relations ensuring continued health, and diversity.

I like the raised path at the Arlington Grove unit blocks, Grove Street, Dulwich Hill, except for there being no fencing, though it isn't a high traffic area, pretty much only used by residents, and therefore not so crucial. I'm glad there'll be raised paths along the Greenway but they necessitate fencing either side for people's safety and habitat protection. At the Waratah Mills site and elsewhere paths could make best use of existing fences if placed alongside the fences.

I'm glad there are rest stops at Cadigal, Old Canterbury Road Johnson Oark and Hercules sections. All weather picnic shelters and facilities are needed where there's space.

I'm making very general statements through lack of direct experience of the sites. I do voluntary work at the Piggot Street site which isn't under consideration here.

#### Submission on the GreenWay Missing Links

Thank you for the opportunity to provide feedback on the proposed works.

#### 1 General

I am an active bushcarer in my local part of the Inner West and I also regularly participate in IWEG (Inner West Environment Group) bird surveys in Dulwich Hill and along Hawthorne Canal. My comments centre on biodiversity and bird habitat. What constitutes functioning bird habitat is often poorly understood. Biodiversity is often talked about but given tokenistic attention.

Much of the green linkage along the rail corridor has been lost, with doubling of the rail corridor. Now the wide shared path will obliterate more of what remains. It is crucial to retain as much as possible of the remainder along the corridor, to restore all areas that are disturbed during construction and to maximise habitat by best-practice restoration.

I am happy to see the GreenWay completed and believe the project will benefit from further refinement.

#### 2 Maintaining biodiversity before and during construction

- 1. Meetings must be held on site with Bushcare representatives, Urban Ecology and Gartner Rose to try to save as much of the native plantings as possible.
- 2. I would like to see a new Urban Ecology officer appointed to solely look after the GreenWay, ensuring bio-diversity is protected and enhanced. Current staff are far too over committed to take on extra duties.
- 3. The GreenWay needs a complex variety of plants, shrubs and trees to improve biodiversity. Plants should adequately represent STIF, Sandstone Freshwater and Coastal Swamp communities. To achieve this a minimum of 60 species should be installed from each community. As a precedent, the Arlington Grove Complex in Grove St Dulwich Hill was required by Marrickville Council to plant 50 different species in their native garden adjoining the GreenWay.
- The contractor employed to install and maintain the revegetation sites must hold relevant qualifications in natural area restoration and have extensive experience. Preferably the contractor will be AABR (Australian Association of Bush Regenerators) accredited.
- 5. Council must provide an assurance that if funds run low, the budget for revegetation will not be cut.
- 6. Materials must be specified for minimum impacts in the natural environment. Eg crushed sandstone for capping over weeds.

#### 3 Maintaining biodiversity after construction

- 1. Maintenance of all revegetated areas should be sufficiently funded to permit weeding to be done by hand as necessary, to ensure native grasses and small ground covers are not removed by mistake.
- 2. Contracts should be put in place for maintenance of the native vegetation in perpetuity and unsatisfactory contractors should be replaced.
- 3. Regular audits must be conducted on the sites, including both flora and fauna, and supplementary planting funded as plants senesce.

#### 4 Comments on specific design aspects

- 1. Gadigal Reserve area
  - I question the retention of the path between Marion St and Haig Av on the west side of the canal. Removal of this will allow creation of an additional natural area and provide a biodiversity benefit.
  - The many weed trees on the east side should be removed.
  - Heavy vehicle access must be managed to avoid destruction of the Gadigal Bushcare site.
- 2. Longport St to Lewisham West LR
  - The path is currently proposed down the middle of the site. Moving it to either side (near the LR track or near the residential properties) would consolidate the area allocated for revegetation and provide a biodiversity benefit.
  - Known Superb Fairy Wren habitat was recently destroyed opposite the LR station. Urgent replanting is required here.
  - Fence off existing plantings beside the proposed dog off-leash area and maintain nearby weedy section as habitat.
  - Retain as much as possible of the weedy embankment at Old Canterbury Rd, opposite the Fred St Bushcare site. It provides connectivity and small bird habitat.
  - 3 Davis St to Terry Rd
    - Reroute the path so it is close the LR and after Terry St reroute it close to properties to consolidate the area allocated for revegetation and provide a biodiversity benefit.
  - 4 Terry Rd to Constitution Rd
    - Reroute the path to the side, to minimise disruption to Johnston Park Bushcare.
  - 5 Hercules Parkland
    - Reroute the path to make it beside the LR line, to consolidate the area allocated for revegetation and provide a biodiversity benefit.
    - Retain a large section of dense weeds fenced off to retain habitat for small birds, insects, reptiles, and small mammals. This should not be disturbed (cleared and planted) until **after** the revegetated areas are established and functioning as habitat.
    - Fence the path during the construction phase and retain permanently to allow new plantings to flourish and provide habitat, and to prevent disturbance to the last remaining creekline in the Inner West. This parkland will be the only large wild area along the GreenWay with width as well as depth. It must be valued as a biodiversity asset, vital for small birds, mammals and reptiles to thrive.

#### Annandale

To whom it may concern,

I writing as a concerned owner and resident of unit Williams Pde, Dulwich Hill regarding the previous and proposed works for the GreenWay Cycleway Project.

I understand that these projects do generate impacts to surrounding resident especially during construction however I'm also excited about what the finished project will provide. The artists impressions on the website show an excellent recreational pathway for all residents to use and enjoy. However, I do feel to date the level of communications and consultation with those directly impacted needs to be improved. This is a key component to managing people's concerns and expectations.

My main concerns and questions are listed below.

#### **Completed Activities**

- With the tree/shrub clearing that occurred on April 1 and 2, I had not received any
  communications regarding the proposed works. The timeline, hours of operation, expected noise
  impacts and the extent of the clearing was certainly not communicated. As a resident directly
  impacted by the works, I feel there should have been better communication. I didn't receive
  even a simple letter drop. This also concerns me as to what level of consultation and
  communication we will receive as construction reaches full swing. Can you provide any plans on
  how this will be addressed moving forward?
- What resulted from the clearing is an increase in noise to my apartment, direct vision of light generated by the light rail but most importantly the reduction in security to our carpark and building areas. I can very easily now walk over the hill and onto the light rail but of greater concern is the access it provides to our car park and other building areas. Can you confirm what plans there are to address these immediate concerns as I know they have been raised by other residents?

#### Future Works

- I have reviewed plans LA-213 and LA-214 which show the area adjacent my apartment (and predominately building 3). It states, "Privacy screening Planting to be considered along the boundary to adjacent properties". Can you clarify what this means exactly? What will the privacy screening be i.e. is it just plants, chain wire fence, light weight concrete panels, retaining walls etc. As mentioned in the point above I'm concerned about security, noise & light impacts from both the pathway and light rail. The trees that were removed in April previously provided this. Can you provide the plan covering key security works e.g. retaining walls, fencings, trees, noise barriers, including timeline?
- Drawings LA 213 & 214 also indicate a "Shared path raised boardwalk". Can you confirm what this means? The drawing legend indicates it's a "Sharepath – FRP mini mesh (raised walkway)? Is this a steel structure as opposed to a timber or concrete one? I'm just curious as to what noise this could create.

- Understanding there is a heap of information on the website, however navigating through this can be time consuming and not easy to find. Are you able to provide the following:

- Inner West Environmental Group [IWEG] has spent <u>many years</u> of hard work with dedicated volunteers effecting bushcare and developing areas of biodiversity. It would be affronting to such dedication for Greenway pathways to be widened and, thus, intrude into the precious bushcare sites.
- Maintaining Bio-diversity A Green Way not a Grey Way
- Meetings to be held on site with Bushcare representatives, Urban Ecology and construction company to save as much of the plantings as possible.
- A new Urban Ecology Officer be appointed to solely look after the Greenway ensuring biodiversity is protected and enhanced.
- The Greenway needs a complex variety of plants, shrubs and trees to improve bio-diversity. In the Arlington grove Complex in Grove St Dulwich Hill, Council requirement was for planting of 50 different species in the native garden adjoining the Greenway.
- The contractor employed to plant and maintain the new plantings to hold relevant **bushcare/bush** regeneration qualifications. Weeding is to be done by hand to ensure native grasses and small ground covers are <u>not</u> removed by mistake; regular audits to be conducted on this work. Contracts be put in place for maintenance of the native vegetation in perpetuity.

To provide for a more effective and safer active transport route, a tunnel should be built under Old Canterbury Rd as soon as feasible. IWC to use best endeavours to seek funding for its construction.

In the mean time would urge IWC to ensure the shortest possible wait times for pedestrians and riders for traffic lights at the Weston St/Edwards St intersection. IWC and the contractor should seek worlds best practice in having "smart" traffic light systems in place that will detect gaps in the traffic and potentially allow for a faster response times, less delay immediately after a crossing phase. Detectors should be used to allow for approaching pedestrians and riders, and any push buttons located in an easily accessible position for riders (e.g. using a waiting rail).

#### **Dulwich Hill: Hercules Street**

For this section as well as other sections, plant species selection is such that pathway width is not reduced due to overgrowing vegetation. Currently both Lomandra and common reed at Richard Murden Reserve reduce the effective Greenway shared path width by up to 1.0m in some places. Lomandra sp. and or plants with similar habit should be located further than 1.0m from the pathway edge - otherwise over time and as demonstrated already at RMR, plants will grow to cover the path, resulting in either a reduction in effective path width, increased maintenance efforts, or both. The first metre from the path should be planted with low ground cover such as native violets, , kidney weed etc.

The existing timber bollards at either end of the existing pathway between New Canterbury Rd and Hercules St should be removed. They are restrictive create a real hazard for all path users and are largely unnecessary in this location to prevent cars from using the path.

#### Stakeholder hosting Community for GreenWay

The established strata community of 1-3 Williams Pde Dulwich Hill comprises 132 apartments with several hundred residents across three buildings and extensive tree cover and gardens. It is a security complex with diverse infrastructure to support the amenity and safety of residents on a busy street in a densely populated precinct of Dulwich Hill.

Until April 1/2, 2023 the community was able to rely on dense bush and tree cover above the Light Rail Corridor for effective security on the eastern boundary.

This cover also gave much amenity representing a green aspect, privacy, quiet and the cooling of the largest

82 apartment building in the complex.

As a 'stakeholder hosting community' for the GreenWay, residents have generally supported the development

and the amenity it promises for cycling and walking in the locality they enjoy, including by viewing the EIS, responding to the REF, inviting an IWC project manager onsite to answer concerns about protection of native trees on boundary and canopy on the embankment, investing in Dilapidation Reports for assets that could be impacted by tunnelling through Constitution Rd bridge abutment and attending local information sessions about the GreenWay design.

This level of formal participation and general awareness, though limited by lack of direct communication and

clear answers to myriad questions of the project, in no way prepared anyone for the level of wholesale mechanized

destruction of all the tree cover, canopy, and habitat on the eastern embankment that was conducted on

April 1/2, 2023. This was carried out without prior consultation and with inadequate notice. A general notice received by some

referred to some clearing and construction of fencing. It was totally irrelevant to the actual shock of the scale and intensity of the

wholesale destruction that took place. All this in advance of the release of the GreenWay design documents

which were held over. Further, responsible professionals vigorously denied that clearing and grubbing would

be conducted on such a scale and following it - gave tinted descriptions of the carefully selective expertise of ecology

consultants issuing permits.

This is a very poor outcome and casts a shadow over the GreenWay and its promises in this community of 'stakeholders' who are hosting the project by living in such close proximity. As there is still not even an Artist Impression of this south section, could the designers have been distracted by the 'smoke and mirrors' ('pre-works', 'net biodiversity gain') involved in keeping the plan in hand from this community, and poorly 'managing its expectations'?

### Expectations of Stakeholder Hosting Community of Inner West Council and GreenWay Contractors 1-3 Williams Pde

At this time after discussion in the community, can be summarised -Consultation schedule commitment given well in advance of works, by IWC and D&C Contractors and that addresses the following concerns:

- Tunnelling impacts at north-east corner Marsbridge

- Security provision now, since removal of barrier April 1/2, by way of appropriate 2m fencing for the full

#### length of the eastern boundary, and

- Privacy screening planning for planting eastern boundary now rather than in 2024-25

- Confirmation that no more trees will be felled in this south section

between Constitution and New Canterbury Rd bridges

- Dust and noise mitigation installed as soon as possible to protect

residents before works begin August 2023

- Guarantee of ongoing maintenance of GreenWay plantings in perpetuity

by qualified bushcare contractors

- Minimum 50 species of trees, shrubs and grasses to be used in replanting

- Status of Retaining Wall at Constitution Rd. bridge corner of 3 Williams

Pde - location relative to boundary, height, impacts on residents

- Height of raised pathway relative to apartment balconies

- Mitigation of water run-off from GreenWay built structures and surfaces

#### Security Assessment 1-3 Williams Pde Dulwich Hill

On Friday April 28, 2023 an independent security assessment of 1-3 Williams Pde was conducted by Const Holly King of Crime Prevention Marrickville, Inner West Police Area Command. Recommendations in the report included:

The following recommendations were made as a result of the security assessment:

• Erect a fence to secure the rear of the unit complex to reduce the likelihood of trespassers on the property and reduce the likelihood of residents accessing the railway corridor.

Hi Ms. Jansen,

I'm a resident of 3 Williams Parade and my unit backs onto the Greenway site in front of the light rail line.

I was very disappointed to say the least, regarding the decimation of foliage carried out on April 1/2, before the Have Your Say was open. It was clearly decided upon regardless of residents concerns. It was far more extreme than projected.

I fear the same for the Project itself. It's going ahead. We know that. What we want is some consideration in regards to privacy, noise, dust and lighting.

1. Without this **natural barrier** we are now open to the pathway, when completed and prior with workers being able to easily access our property. We would like a **security** barrier of some kind put in place, whether it be a fence or some native plants or greenery, sooner rather than after the project is done. Right now it looks like a moon scape. It's horrible.

2. **Noise and dust** etc. Can't be avoided I know but some attempt at minimisation would be appreciated. Also what hours are works being done? We need to know. I'm a shift worker in the entertainment industry so noise greatly affects my sleep. Including and especially weekends.

3. What is to be the **lighting** situation along this path? Is it to be on at night? If so, how late? This also affects our ability for sleep, privacy etc. Also have lighting is surely not good for the environment. The 'Green' aspect of Greenway is a bit of a joke really. It's a concrete path built by a lot of machinery etc. A few native plants doesn't really make it green.

Whatever is to happen, we need transparency, and honesty and this is not what we've experienced thus far. Thousands of locals live along this section and deserve to be considered.

#### Dear Ms Jansen

As a resident of **Constant of Sector 1** in Dulwich Hill, I was horrified at the destruction of the trees and shrubs that were along this side of the proposed 'Greenway Walk'. I am aware that this was a project that was in discussion prior to the Lightrail and has been advocated for by many locals. I too am an advocate of progress and the Greenway Walk however I was ill prepared for the 'some trees being' removed' to the absolute devastation that occurred 1st and 2nd April 2023 with all vegetation and trees removed including the homes and shelter for the many birds and possums that resided here.

The Innerwest council has a reputation for being 'Green' and preserving the environment however it appears only when it suits. On the other side of the railway which was the original location however due to the preservation of a Bat Colony, it was changed. The destruction of nests and homes for birds and possums (which obviously perished as well) seems to be of no consequence to the Council.

I had to vacate my apartment for the two days during the work times that started at 7am as it was impossible to do anything or even stay there with the noise so I dread to think how I will manage to work when the actual work proceeds.

@ - I urge you to review this horrific decision by the council to not just remove the trees needed to make the 'Greenway' but to destroy our native animals and birds. I have attached a photo of a possum on the wall that I took on the 12th March a few weeks before the clearing. I shudder to think of the poor birds and animals that were lost during the work of clearing the site.

A very important factor that has been created by the removal of every tree is that the security of **security** is seriously compromised. Further down from the wall is clear access to our car park which was secure as the canopy of trees and shrubbery made it impossible to penetrate from this side. As you will note from the photo taken from my bedroom, people on the lightrail as well as walkers in the future are just below me and all my privacy has gone. I live alone and scared of the fact that I am so exposed and could potentially be in danger due to the lack of security. Now everyone travelling on the lightrail can see into my bedrooms and balcony. This may give people ideas who would not have any visual of our balconies or property prior.

What is required is immediate boundary fencing and plantation of trees that will shade, hide and secure our properties once again.

I would appreciate a timeline of when this can occur as you can see from the photo, we have no security and my apartment is the closest to the boundary wall.





As a resident of **Contract of** I overall support the draft Greenway proposal but I have two major objections I would like noted:

#### Access through the Waratah Mills Carpark

The design plan continues to propose the use of a small side path from the Greenway through the current locked gates onto the easement in the Waratah Mills car park easement to Davis Street. I strenuously object to this access point as it will increase the interaction between cars and pedestrians and cyclists which has the potential for a serious accident and injury to occur.

#### Replanting

As a significant amount of trees (which provide privacy and screening) will be impacted from the Greenway I would like a clear specific timeline of replanting to be provide along with consideration to be given to more diverse (species and heights) range of plants to be included

In my view the biggest risk to the GreenWay is a Light Rail corridor, from the weed management perspective, completely neglected; poisonous, noxious weeds grow undisturbed and continuously "jump the fence" and into Council land. I am writing to express my concerns and horror as to what I witnessed when the trees were removed for the new greenway. It was done in such a barbaric, ruthless manner.

I have watched to those trees grow over the years.

I believe that half of those trees were not ment to be cut down.

There is no privacy for majority of the residents, the noise of the light rail is louder and it is the complete opposite that was stated that would happen.

The early work in the weekend of <u>1-2 April</u> will require some weeding and the removal of some trees to accommodate the GreenWay path and fence and/or as they are in poor condition or considered weeds. Is it not (meant to read 'It is not') a blanket 'clearing and grubbing' exercise.

Standing on the bridge at the Arlington light rail stop looking at the mess that has been created. It looks like deforestation at its worst kind. And to now say that the tunnel that has to be drilled out will only just fit???? This obviously was not thought out as thoroughly as it should have been. A response from Senior Engineer at IWC (bolding added) reads in part as follows:
